As we are adjusting to the "New Normal", Muskan Foundation has taken steps to continue its program and services online. We officially re-opened our online programs & services from June 15 after a short summer break. We believe in the continual progress and development of our Children with Multiple Disabilities. Hence while being in the safety of our homes, our Special Educators are conducting online classes providing one-to-one child-teacher ratio so that each child receives individual attention. Also now that lockdown has been partially lifted, many working parents have resumed their work or have started working from home, making it difficult for some children to avail online services. Despite of this issue, Our Special Educators are collaborating with the parents, adjusting when the smart phone is available and conducting online classes. With the hard work of our Special Educators and the constant support of our parents, our children have been able to progress steadily. Our children have progressed in the area of reading & writing, learning ADL skills, improving cognition and fine motor skills.


NEWS & UPDATE

The WHO in collaboration with Autism Speaks organised Caregiver Skills Training programme through Ummeed which our Special Educators were very grateful to attend. The WHO CST consisted of nine group sessions which focused on training the caregiver on how to use everyday play and home activities and routines as opportunities for learning and development. The sessions specifically addressed communication, engagement, daily living skills, challenging behaviour and caregiver coping strategies.





In India, there are 5 million people with deafblindness and Muskan Foundation one of the organisation which rehabilitates children with deafblindness through its programs and services. Muskan celebrated Helen day, a deafblind American Activist by attending a webinar on 'Inclusion of Persons with Disabilities'. 


A Mother toddler Program in session


A Special Educator conducting stimulating excercise
