
One of our parents shared with everyone the significance of the Holi. It was a fun day for everyone.

Case Study of the Month

Name of the Student: - Paras Thakkar

Disability: Low vision with locomotor disability

Age of the child: 7 years

Special Education: Early intervention

Area of development: Cognition

Goal of the Month: Number Identification From 1 to 5.

Material: Navnirmit kit & different objects

Beginning of the month: In this month Paras will learn the addition of one-digit numbers with the help of the Navnirmit kit & different objects.

Sessions: In the following session, the teacher explained addition with the help of practical examples. In the next session Paras did the addition of 1 digit number with Navnirmit kit through teacher's verbal prompt.

End of the month: Now Paras is able to perform addition of one-digit numbers independently with different objects & Navnirmit Kit.

Therapies and Activities

Physio Therapy

Name of the child: Bhargav Dhaigude

Disability: Global Development Delay + Nustagmus

Area of concern: independent standing balance, independent walking, staircase, single-leg stance.

GOAL: Improve independent standing and walking, dynamic balance, single-leg stance, staircase

When Akash came for assessment:	With regular Occupational Therapy Akash can now:

Parental Guidance: Home program techniques and frequency are explained and taught to the mother. The importance of splints was explained

Name of the child: Amir Parker

Disability: Visual Impairment, Delay development

Area of Concern: Speech and Language Development

Goal: Vocabulary Development

When Amir came for assessment:	With regular Occupational Therapy Amir
	can now:
 He was speaking only 3-4 words vegetative functions (sipping, chewing) were not developed. phrases were not developed. 	 Vegetative functions (swallowing, chewing, sipping) have developed Tongue and lip movements are developing for speech Started to speak in phrases. (3 words together) Following verbal instructions. Following verbal instructions vocabulary is developing.

Parental Guidance: The mother has been taught different strategies to develop Language and vegetative functions, and the same is being done at home by mother.

When Amir Came to Muskan Foundation he knew he was an Intellectual Impairment child in an earlier stage. He should be able to write standing & sleeping lines with minimum verbal & gesture help. In the beginning, Bushra wrote standing & sleeping lines on stencils. he needed to be guided in writing standing & sleeping lines with verbal & gesture help. In the next session, he joined dots & learned to write without stencils with maximum verbal prompts & physical help. Amir is now able to write standing & sleeping lines with help of dots with minimum physical help & verbal prompt.
